

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



e) The parties agree that the objective of the present MoU is to establish a cooperation program in order to collaborate towards the formation of students, academics and researchers for the promotion and development of their respective areas of interest.

#### 2. METHOD FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES:

f) In order to achieve the aforementioned objectives, both parties, in mutual agreement, shall develop cooperation programs and projects that will specify the commitments each of them is to make for the performance of said programs.

#### 3. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION:

- g) Whereas, SPS and CCP recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, the two parties shall:
  - i. Research Collaborations: Faculty/Researchers/Students of SPS and CCP can collaborate in future research projects that either involve working cooperatively with partner institutions and/or cover a research topic with an international component. Activities include, but are not limited to, efforts toward developing proposals for collaborative research, coauthoring publication, conducting joint research projects, or establishing joint research centers etc.
  - ii. Faculty Exchange with Partner Universities: Faculty members of SPS and CCP can travel between to participate in activities that can enhance their international / national experience and knowledge and also to foster

# 4. FUNDING:

h) Expenses for airfare, transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual. Students will pay their registration, courses or professional practices at their home university, so that they can be recognized afterwards.

i) Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the university, which shall provide every help necessary for them to

j) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors / researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

k)Students, professors and officers must acquire a medical insurance policy. The universities may offer them advice in seeking appropriate insurance.

# 5. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP:

1) The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labor nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

# 6. CREDITS / ACCREDITATION:

- m) Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the Institution / Host University/Government. However, the home university / Institution reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.
- n) The Host University / Institution shall issue a certification recognizing the grades obtained, as well as the hours invested or projects/papers completed by the students.

#### 7. RIGHTS AND DUTIES:

- o) The host university / Institution is committed to counseling and supporting exchange students through advice on academic and administrative procedures, as well as to foster their integration, inviting and encouraging guest students to become involved in student life.
- p) The institutions shall act as facilitators, but they will have no obligation whatsoever in terms of the actions, behaviors or financial aspects of the students/participants involved in the exchange.

q) The students/participants shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as regular

Any violation of the laws of the receiving country and/or the rules of the Host University / Institution by an exchange participant shall be grounds for the immediate termination of the privileges in the context of this Agreement.

r) The host institution agrees to assist to provide boarding, lodging and necessities and to provide work space, library and laboratory facilities as appropriate.

# 8. AUTONOMY:

s) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.

#### 9. TERM:

- t) This MOU shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be automatically renewed thereafter for another five (5) years unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- u) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

#### 10. CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

v)Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each university / Institution. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at any time in writing.

## 11. ACTION PLANS:

w) Every work program or specific activity that is agreed upon between both institutions shall be defined through an action plan, which shall be under the responsibility of two individuals, appointed respectively by each university / Institution, and which shall define the following aspects:

The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into on the 21st day of Mar'23by and between Tata Consultancy Services Ltd., a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 and having its corporate office at TCS House, Raveline Street, Fort, Mumbai 400001, India (hereinafter referred to as "TCS"), and Saint Paul Institute Of Professional Studies and having its principal office at 7/1, boundary road, Near Lalaram-Nagar Indore(hereinafter referred to as "Institute").

WHEREAS TCS is inter alia engaged in the business of provision of various information technology services, business solutions, consultancy and outsourcing services worldwide; and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize each other competencies and hereto agree that a strategic relationship between them will benefit each other.

NOW THIS MOU aims to capture the understanding reached between TCS and Institute regarding each other's roles and responsibilities:

This will be done by placing the option of this course curriculum in all communication medium (College Website, Student Application forms, Brochures etc.) to ensure maximum students undertake the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum.
- Institute will set highest standards of selection for the students and ensure that the students who undertake the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum would put in full effort and contribution to make learning outcomes successful. Focus would be on ensuring students
- who have a great propensity to participate actively and contribute to learning in a group as well as individual mode.

- Institute should ensure timely nomination of faculty for attending the TTT Program and delivering the TCS Designed Course(s) in a timely and satisfactory manner and is based on the broad guideline as below. Final choice on the selection of faculty will lie with institute.

  - 5+ years' experience in teaching the specific courses which they would be teaching (flexibility allowed)
  - c) Familiar with recent developments in related field
  - d) Effective communication and articulation of scenarios
  - e) Ability to drive interactive sessions
  - f) Willingness to learn and lead
- Institute will own the responsibility of conducting the exams/assessments of student performance for the TCS Designed Course(s) and across all the subjects of the Curriculum. As an input it may consider the assessment criteria as suggested by TCS for assessment to be done through written exams, internal assessments, market visits and take home assignments by the nominated faculty, where each parameter may have an assigned weightage so that students are assessed effectively for their all-round performance.
- Institute shall ensure that all the students selected for the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum will sign individual confidentiality undertaking substantially in the format as set forth in Annexure B hereunder, to ensure that the course material is not used or disposed off inappropriately and take utmost care not to copy or share the course hand outs and materials that are TCS provided copyrighted material with anyone else. The course material is solely for the students' learning purposes and only students, who undertake the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum shall possess the course material at any time. The

course material has to be destroyed / disposed only by shredding, in order to avoid any unauthorized use.

- Institute shall ensure that the faculty from Institute who would be trained through the TTT Program will sign individual confidentiality undertaking, substantially in the format as set forth in Annexure C hereunder, to ensure that the course material is used appropriately only for the purpose of instruction of the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum. The faculty should not use this course material for other courses or for any other purpose whatsoever and also should not dispose it in a manner that can lead the course material falling in hands of those who should not be recipients of the course work.
- The faculty trained by TCS would teach the TCS Designed Course(s), only as long as this MOU is valid. Once the validity of this MOU is over, they would need to be recertified with a TTT Program post renewal of the MOU.
- Institute shall ensure availability of all requisite facilities, infrastructure, cooperation, etc. required to seamlessly deliver the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum to the applicable students. The lectures are to be scheduled during the normal working days of the Institute or as decided by Institute. In cases where TCS' assistance is availed by Institute for delivery of the TCS Designed Course(s), TCS and Institute will mutually agree to a schedule for the same. Institute recognizes that timely and continued provision of the facilities by Institute is a condition precedent to the completion of the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum in time. Any delay or failure in the provision of agreed facilities will hamper the timely completion of the course, and TCS shall not be held liable for the same.
- Institute shall permit the applicable TCS faculty/personnel engaged pursuant to this MOU, reasonable access to the premises of Institute, for the purpose of delivery of the TTT Program or to fulfill it role under this MOU or assist the Institute in any other manner in relation to this MOU.
- At the end of the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum, any formalities with respect to awarding certificate of course completion to the students will be done by Institute in accordance with the rules/ procedures followed by Institute.
- At the end of the course Institute shall allow TCS to make pre-placement offers to the students who are part of the course based on a selection criteria defined by TCS. Institute shall also provide first slot to TCS during campus recruitment/ placement and Institute will facilitate the process for students to accept an offer from TCS.

# III) OTHER TERMS & CONDITIONS

- TCS and the Institute will jointly evaluate and agree on applicable fees or service charges (if any), to cover the costs of designing, developing, training, branding, delivering and sustaining the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum that may be offered in collaboration with TCS and any costs associated therewith such as travelling, accommodation, etc.
- Upon mutual agreement, TCS and Institute may at any time enter into a specific definitive
  agreement(s) (hereinafter referred as "Definitive Agreement(s)") setting out therein the
  mutually agreed detailed terms and conditions applicable to the various courses to be
  provided by TCS under such Definitive Agreement(s).
- For the TCS Designed Course(s) which are agreed to be implemented, TCS will provide one master copy of course material in hard copy form to the Institute, which will be received by the faculty duly designated by Institute in writing to TCS. The said course material may be reproduced in hard copy form only, solely for the purpose of being issued by the duly designated faculty to the students who enroll for the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculumfor the duration of the course. Except as permitted herein, the course material provided by TCS shall not be reproduced, copied, translated, adapted, broadcasted, hosted or transmitted (including electronically) in any form. The supporting material, if any, for

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faculty members will be separately provided to the faculty members and shall be used by the faculty members only for the purposes of the instruction of the TCS Designed Course(s) at the Institute. Institute shall ensure that the original master copy of course material and supporting material for faculty members provided by TCS and copies of the same including portions thereof (i) is treated strictly as confidential documents; (ii) shall only be in the possession of the designated faculty of Institute; and (iii) shall not be displayed or circulated in libraries or forums where any person not enrolled under the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum may access the same.

- For the entire process involved for offering the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum, Institute will seek prior written permission from TCS before publishing any related information regarding this TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum offering initiative in collaboration with TCS, in the press, media, social network, blogs, internet and in any other allied public channels.
- Unless otherwise agreed by the Parties separately in writing, each Party will be responsible for its own individual costs in conducting its duties and obligations under this MOU.

#### IV) INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- Institute agrees and acknowledges that any and all intellectual property rights in or to course contents and curriculum of the TCS Designed Course(s) and TTT Program and any and all modifications, enhancements, alterations, additions, adaptations, translations to the same, or derivative works thereof, or feedback received with respect to them, shall be done only by or with prior written permission of TCS and vest with TCS and/or its licensors. For the term of this MOU, TCS grants to the Institute a non-exclusive, non-transferable, non sub-licensable, limited right and license to use and reproduce the course material in hard copy form only for the purposes of, and as permitted under, this MOU. All rights not expressly granted herein shall remain with TCS.
- Institute agrees to retain all of TCS' and/or its licensors' logo, trademark, copyright notices and other proprietary markings or notice on the course material. Institute shall not, permit any persons to, remove, alter, obscure or otherwise render illegible any of TCS' logo, trademark, copyright notice or other proprietary or confidentiality markings that may be placed on the course material or part thereof provided to Institute hereunder without prior written approval of TCS. Institute shall include on all copies of all or part of the course material a reproduction of TCS' and/or its licensors' logo, trademark, copyright notices and other proprietary markings or notices as included in the course material provided by TCS.
- TCS shall also continue to own all and any intellectual property developed prior to, or independently of this MOU.
- By entering into this MOU, Institute covenants and undertakes:
- (a) To respect TCS' intellectual property;
  - (b) Not to use TCS' intellectual property without the prior express written consent of TCS;
  - (c) Ensure the confidentiality of such intellectual property of TCS within enrolled students and nominated faculty;
  - (d) Not to use or permit use TCS' intellectual property other than for the purpose and duration of this MOU.
  - (e) Promptly report any misuse of the TCS' intellectual property which comes to its notice and assist and support TCS in remedying and/or protecting any misuse/infringement of TCS' intellectual property subject of this MOU.
- Institute agrees that it shall not gain by virtue of this MOU any rights of ownership or any other interest, right, or title in or to any copyrights, patents, trade secrets, trade marks, or any other intellectual property or proprietary rights owned by TCS. Except as otherwise explicitly agreed between the Parties, any and all works developed in the course of performing obligations pursuant to this MOU, including all intellectual property rights in or related thereto, and all new inventions, innovations, works or ideas developed by TCS in the course of performance of its activities under this MOU will belong to TCS.

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- If the Parties undertake any joint development in the course of providing services under this MOU, any such joint development will be governed by a separate agreement to be negotiated in good faith by the Parties prior to the commencement of any joint development efforts.
- Neither Party shall use any name, trademark, service mark or symbol of the other Party in any publicity release or advertising material or for any other purpose whatsoever without securing the prior written consent of that other Party. The Parties may, however, mention the non-stylized name of the other Party and areas of collaboration in their official websites, presentations and analyst reports and include the existence of this Memorandum in its regular list of academic/industry collaborations. Institute agrees that any and all use of TCS name and trademarks shall be in accordance with the provisions of Annexure D.

#### V) CONFIDENTIALITY

- During the term of this MOU, TCS may disclose to Institute its Confidential Information. Confidential Information shall mean all information marked "Confidential" or under any similar legend indicating the confidentiality of the information or information which by its nature is confidential or acknowledged and agreed herein as confidential, except such information as is (a) previously known to Institute at the time of disclosure and not subject to confidentiality under any other agreement between the Parties, or (b) independently developed by Institute and not derived from the Confidential Information supplied by TCS or the participation of individuals who have had access to Confidential Information of TCS, (c) disclosed to Institute by a third partywho lawfully acquired such information without restriction, and is not subject to confidentiality obligations, or (d) in or subsequently comes into the public domain (other than as a result of a breach of this MOU), or (e) required to be disclosed by Institute by law, regulation, court order or other legal process. Institute acknowledges and agrees that course contents and curriculum of the TCS Designed Course(s) and TTT Program is Confidential Information of TCS irrespective of whether it is labelled as confidential or not.
- Institute shall hold such Confidential Information in strict confidence for TCS and shall not use it for any purpose except in furtherance of the relationship set forth in this MOU, or except as it may be authorized by TCS in writing. Institute shall further be responsible for the compliance of the foregoing by its students, employees, faculty or agents who have access to Confidential Information in relation to the purpose of this MOU.
- Institute acknowledges and agrees that a breach of any of its obligations contained herein will result in irreparable injury to TCS for which there will be no adequate remedy at law, and TCS shall be entitled to apply for equitable relief, including injunction and specific performance, in the event of any breach or threatened breach or intended breach of its obligations herein by the Institute. Such remedies, however, shall not be deemed to be the exclusive remedies for any breach of the obligations but shall be in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity.
- All Confidential Information is provided as is, without any warranties express, implied or otherwise, regarding its accuracy, completeness or performance.

#### VI) TERMINATION

Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving ninety (90) days advance written notice to the other Party. On termination, each Party shall return to the other party all such confidential and proprietary information, documents and reference material and any copies thereof of the other Party in its possession. If the MOU expires or notice of termination is issued during the Academic Year when the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum is/are in progress, the termination shall take effect post completion of the batch(es) that has/have already opted for the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum. New students/batches will not be offered the TCS Designed Course(s) / Curriculum once the termination notice has been issued. The right of each Party to terminate this MOU with immediate effect for material

- This MOU can be extended or terminated by mutual consent of the Parties in writing. Notice period not to renew.

The parties acknowledge and agree that this MOU does not create any financial or funding obligation on either party and that such obligations shall arise only upon joint execution of a subsequent agreement or work plan (which shall include a budget) that specifically delineates the terms and nature of such obligations and that references this MOU. Such subsequent agreements or work plans, and budgets, will be subject to funding being specifically available for the purposes outlined therein. All funds are further subject to a mutual obligation to expend funds solely in accordance with the agreed-upon budget and the line items contained therein.

#### XII) NO JOINT VENTURE

Notwithstanding the terms "Partners" and "Partnership", the Partners agree that they are not entering into a Legal Partnership, joint, venture, or other such business arrangement, nor is the purpose of the Partners to enter into a commercial undertaking for monetary gain. Neither Partner will refer to or treat the arrangements under this Agreement as a Legal Partnership or take any action inconsistent with such intention.

#### XIII) DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The Partners hereby agree that, in the event of any dispute between the Partners relating to this MoU, the Partners shall first seek to resolve the dispute through informal discussions. In the event any dispute cannot be resolved informally within sixty (60) calendar and consecutive days, the Partners agree that the dispute will be negotiated between the Partners through mediation if Partners can agree on a mediator. The costs of mediation shall be shared equally by the Partners. Neither Partner waives its legal rights to adjudicate this MoU in a legal forum.

1. This Memorandum of Understanding for Student Exchange Program and Voluntary Supportive Work is entered into as of the date of the last signature below by and between.

- 2. Herein after Memorandum of Understanding is to be referred as 'MOU' and both the institutes in above as no. 1a and no. 1b as 'Partner Institutes'.
- 3. The relationship of the parties to this Agreement is that of independent contractors.

4. This Agreement may be modified at any time in writing signed by both parties.

5. That the Partner Institutes agree to establish a reciprocal faculty/ student exchange program for the educational and cultural enrichment of both institutes under the following terms:

 Partner Institutes agrees to exchange individual students for a semester or an academic year, ideally on a one-for-one basis.

- ii. During the term of MOU, each Partner Institutes may send up to 100 students who are enrolled as regular students per calendar year. The number of students may be modified from time to time by mutual agreement. Uniformity in the number of exchange students is required over the term of the MOU.
- iii. Students participating in this exchange shall be exempt from paying any fees for the programme. However, special fee if any occur in future may be payable for them (such special fee will be decided mutually between Partner Institutes). In such case the host institution must provide information regarding such special fees in advance.

iv. Partner Institutes shall make reasonable efforts to assist participating students for travel, food, medical facilities in emergency, etc. Also, the host institution will provide documentation and forms as necessary to the guest institute.

- v. Participating students will be selected by their home institution on the basis of the following criteria. The students shall:
  - a) Be citizens or permanent residents of India.
  - b) Have completed at least one year of full-time study at the home institution.
  - c) Have academic performance records ranging from good to excellent.

e) Must been enrolled with the affiliating University.

- 6. Each Partner Institutes will forward applications for exchange at least one month before the start of the academic session Each Partner Institutes reserves the right to reject candidate's application if the same is found misfit for the programme.
- 7. The Partner Institute will provide each other with adequate information on the performance of participating students, including a short report (or its equivalent) as soon as possible after the students' completion of the exchange.
- 8. Students participating under the terms of this Agreement shall be subject to the rules, regulations, and codes of conduct of the host institution. The host institution shall have the right

Whereas, St. Francis Hospital, Indore a pioneer and dedicated hospital located in Indore, Madhya Pradesh is a minority society owned and established and administered by the Catholic Diocese of Indore and is situated at 10, Old Sehore Road, Indore, Madhya Pradesh, 452001 and website 'www.stfrancishospital.in'.

Whereas, St. Paul Institute of Professional Studies, Indore an affiliated institution from Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya, Indore of UGC is a pioneer educational institution. It is a minority institution owned and established and administered by the Catholic Diocese of Indore at 7/1, Boundary Road, Near Lalaram Nagar, Indore, Madhya Pradesh 452001 and website 'www.spipsindore.com' (hereinafter referred to as SPIPS)

The representatives of St. Paul Institute of Professional Studies, Indore and Indore Diocese Social Service Society, Indore, M.P. agree to this Memorandum of Understanding.

Whereas SPIPS and St. Francis Hospital, Indore (hereinafter jointly referred to as Parties) have agreed to enter into an academic collaboration in multiple curricular and co-curricular activities for mutual benefit to the constituent stakeholders, particularly for the students and faculty members of the Parties.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has, entered into between the Parties which witnessed as hereunder.

- The purpose of this MOU is to build friendship and goodwill and foster a relationship
  that will promote mutual intellectual exchanges between students, faculty members and
  administrators of St. Paul Institute of Professional Studies, Indore and St. Francis
  Hospital, Indore.
- 2. In an effort to experience the lifelong learning process, both parties are prepared to participate in a formal exchange programme that seeks to promote an academic exchange and to provide collaboration in:
- i. This exchange program encompasses the promotion of:
  - a. The organization of joint research projects and publications
  - Collaboration in the area of education and continuing education including curriculum development and co-curricular activities.
  - Conduct of and participation in seminars, conferences, symposiums and faculty training programmes.

d. Other academic exchanges such as Skill Development, Best Practices etc. To which both the institutions may agree.

ii. The implementation of any and all exchange programmes will be separately negotiated and determined by both institutions by way of separate agreement and shall be subject to applicable UGC Regulations.

iii. Participation in the exchange programme will continue as long as both institutions deem the experience mutually beneficial. It is the intent and desire of both institutions to continue to develop inter-disciplinary knowledge relations and intellectual growth through the exchange of people and ideas.

iv. The primary goal of this project is to develop a model MOU for consideration by hospitals and potentially other healthcare entities within a specified healthcare

system.

During emergencies there are often critical shortages of healthcare workers.
 Accordingly, the following personnel may be transferred between parties subject to limitations set forth below:

vi. Employees. Lending hospitals may allow or encourage the voluntary transfer of employees to a requesting hospital under the terms of this MOU. No employee may be ordered to transfer to a requesting hospital if the employee is not willing to be transferred. Each party shall maintain a list of current employees who may be willing to transfer to a requesting hospital during an emergency.

vii. Contractors. Parties may allow the transfer of contractors to a requesting hospital.

All transferred contractors provide their services to the requesting hospital voluntarily. Whenever possible, contractors with a prior or existing relationship with the requesting hospital should be transferred first.

viii. Services: The provider undertakes to provide the service in a meticulous, precise, reliable, professional manner and at the highest level of service, to the complete satisfaction.

ix. The provider will extend priority admission facilities to the beneficiaries, whenever possible. However the right of admission will always be the prerogative of the provider.

x. Provider shall ensure that medical treatment/facility with all due care and accepted standards is extended to the beneficiary.

xi. The agreement is subject to the detailed schedule of fees submitted by the provider which has to be accepted.

xii. Provider shall allow official to visit the beneficiary and shall not interfere with the medical treatment of the patient.

xiii. Provider agrees to have bills audit on case-to-case basis as and when necessary with audit team. But at a prearranged and agreed time and date only.

xiv. Employer-Employee Relationship Shall Not Exist

xv. It is agreed that no employee-employer relationship shall exist between the parties and that the provider services as an independent contractor for all intents and purposes.

xvi. Provider will ensure that ALL the medical personnel / specialists working, whether full time/part-time, honorary or visiting, in his hospital has their own and adequate professional indemnity Insurance to cover themselves.

- 3. Both parties are responsible for their own costs in relation to this Memorandum of Understanding unless otherwise agreed. However, while on account of the MOU, registration fees for any programme/activity, if any, will be waved-off mutually, the hosting institution will assist the travelling/visiting institution in making all arrangements with regards to local travel, accommodation etc. (with the cost to be borne by the visiting institution).
- Provider will ensure that ALL the medical personnel / specialists working, whether full time/part-time, honorary or visiting, in his hospital has their own and adequate professional indemnity Insurance to cover themselves.
- 5. The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU. The Parties shall cooperate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents) as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. Along with the Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

6. Primary responsibility of obtaining Authorisation letter would be of the policyholder and Hospitats/Provider could only assist if required and if possible. All the requests for preauthorisation should be stamped and authenticated by Hospital Authorities.

7. In case the sum available is considerably less than the estimated treatment cost,

Provider should follow their normal norms of deposit/ running bills etc.

- 8. Once the Authorisation is issued, and the treatment started, no cancellation.
- BUT payment of amount or bill submitted (whichever is less) MUST be paid in full.
   Any disputes will be addressed to the Apex Body for settlement ONLY after such payment is done.
- 10. SPIPS affirms this MOU by the signature of their officials duly authorized to enter into and to implement the same.
- 11. It is expressly agreed that both the Parties are acting under this MOU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party
- 12. This MOU will become effective from the date herein mentioned above and shall remain valid for a period of three years unless either Party terminates the same on three month's written notice to the other. Notwithstanding any such termination, any programme that is being implemented under Clause 2 (i) above shall continue till its full completion.
- 13. There is no financial commitment on the part of both the Parties to take up any programme mentioned in the MOU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

- 14. This MOU will be reviewed at the end of the third year and subject to mutual consensus may be renewed on such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed.

The mandate of NGO is solidarity with the poor and the marginalized people in the society in all the activities. Janvikas works for the integral development of the underprivileged and marginalized people, who are deprived of their right to live as dignified and responsible citizens because of their ignorance, illiteracy and poverty. Janvikas pays special attention to the welfare of the unorganized labourers, waste picking women and children, unemployed youth, street children, migrant and nomadic people. THE NGO collaborate with everyone making effort to create an environment of justice, peace and integrity of creation.

The aim of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to establish a framework for strengthening operational partnership between the office in St. Paul Institute of Professional Studies, Indore and Janvikas Society, Indore. Under the auspices of this framework, the Parties shall develop specific activities, projects or programmes to be implemented in a spirit of co-operation and common commitment to further the protection and assistance of recognized refugees and other persons of concern to NGO and to seek solutions for their problems. Respecting the separate mandates and activities of each organization, the MOU accordingly outlines areas for collaboration. 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# Memorandum of Understanding

## for Student Exchange Program and Voluntary Supportive Work

- 1. This Memorandum of Understanding for Student Exchange Program and Voluntary Supportive Work is entered into as of the date of the last signature below by and between.
  - a. St. Paul Institute of Professional Studies, 7/1 Boundary Road Lalaram Nagar, Indore, 452001, Madhya Pradesh (India)
  - Jain Diwakar College, Sch. No. 55 C, Plot No. 665 A, New Palasia, Indore, 452001, Madhya Pradesh (Indore)
- 2. Herein after Memorandum of Understanding is to be referred as 'MOU' and both the institutes in above as no. 1a and no. 1b as 'Partner Institutes'.
- 3. The relationship of the parties to this Agreement is that of independent contractors.
- 4. This Agreement may be modified at any time in writing signed by both parties.
- 5. That the Partner Institutes agree to establish a reciprocal student exchange program for the educational and cultural enrichment of both institutes under the following terms:
  - Partner Institutes agrees to exchange individual students for a semester or an academic year, ideally on a one-for-one basis.

- o) The host university / Institution is committed to counselling and supporting the students through advice on academic procedures, as well as to fostering their integration, inviting and encouraging Subject Experts to become acquainted with student environment.
- p) The institutions shall act as facilitators, but they will have no obligation whatsoever in terms

- q) The Subject experts shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as regular students/faculty, and shall observe the norms and rules of the Host University / Institution and in the host country. Any violation of the laws of the receiving country and/or the rules of the Host University / Institution by an exchange participant shall be grounds for the immediate termination of the privileges in the context of this Agreement.
- r) The host institution agrees to assist in providing workspace, library and class facilities as appropriate.

### 8. AUTONOMY:

s) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.

### 9. TERM:

- t) This MoU shall be effective for five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement and shall be renewed thereafter for another five (5) years with the agreement of both parties unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- u) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly outlined in the action plans.

### 10. CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

v)Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each university / Institution. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at any time in writing.

### 11. ACTION PLANS:

w) Every work program or specific activity that is agreed upon between both institutions shall be defined through an action plan, which shall be under the responsibility of two individuals, appointed respectively by each university / Institution, and which shall define the following

y) The parties may amend or amplify this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. Said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signature. The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them.


